



MAMMAL FINGER PUPPETS

Directions: Color your animals, cut out, wrap strip around finger and cut paper on both sides for a snug fit, glue ends together, put on finger.




AMERICAN BLACK WELSH MOUNTAIN SHEEP

These sheep are herbivores, so their diet mostly consists of grasses, hays and oats.




STRAW-COLORED FRUIT BAT

The straw-colored fruit bat is native to Sub-Saharan Africa.




GREVY'S ZEBRA

Their tails are long with a tassel at the end used to swat insects.




GUINEA HOG

Guinea hogs have hairy coats, upright ears and a curly tail.




BIRD FINGER PUPPETS

Directions: Color your animals, cut out, wrap strip around finger and cut paper on both sides for a snug fit, glue ends together, put on finger.




RHINOCEROS HORNBILL

Hornbills have what appears to be a second beak, or "horn," growing out of their forehead, hence the name "hornbill."




ROADRUNNER

As their name suggests, roadrunners actually prefer running to flying.




BALD EAGLE
