# Getting Started: Talking Points

We want you to be comfortable sharing the campaign and its importance. Here are the main talking points:

## **How do handheld electronics impact gorillas?**

Cell phones and other small electronics contain a mineral called coltan, which is mined all over the world, including from areas in Africa that gorillas call home. When we recycle our small electronic devices, we reduce the demand for coltan and the destruction of gorilla habitat.

## **What happens to my phone/device?**

We ship all donations to our recycling partner, Eco-Cell, where devices are repurposed or recycled. All proceeds from donated devices support the Association of Zoos and Aquariums' "Gorilla SAFE" initiative. Through ZNE's Gorilla SAFE partnership, we work with the Wildlife Conservation Society to support Cross-River gorilla conservation at the Afi Mountain Wildlife Sanctuary.




# Start Collecting



# Send in your Devices



In late April, or once your box is overflowing with donations, you're ready to ship!

1. Email us at [savegorillas@zoonewengland.org](mailto:savegorillas@zoonewengland.org) with the weight of the box and your return address.
2. We'll email you back with Eco-Cell's printable pre-paid UPS shipping label.
3. Affix the label to your box, and drop off at your nearest UPS store.

Note: If you're local, you can drop off donations at Franklin Park Zoo or Stone Zoo any time we're open.



# FAQs

## **Is there a weight or size limit to the boxes?**

The maximum recommended shipping weight is 50 pounds, so you want to make sure your boxes aren't too big. We've found that the ideal box size is between 12"x12"x12" and 18" x 18" x 18". Many office supply stores like Office Depot and Staples often carry this size shipping box. Call your local store to find out more.

## **What devices can I recycle?**

Our recycling partner, Eco-Cell, accepts cell phones, smart phones, iPads, iPod, tablets, Apple watches, adapters, chargers, MP3 players, handheld gaming systems and their accessories for recycling.

## **What condition do my devices have to be in to be accepted for recycling?**

Devices can be in any condition. From big, heavy phones to ones with cracked screens that no longer work, we'll recycle them all!

## **I have an old laptop that no longer works. Can I recycle that as part of the campaign?**

Large electronic devices such as desktop computers, monitors, laptops, game consuls, televisions, and calculators are NOT accepted for the campaign. However, these electronics also contain coltan, and we highly recommend you recycle them properly. Here in Boston, the city holds "Household Hazardous Waste" drop-off days, or you can contact the city for a "Special Collection" pickup at your home. Many electronic stores like Apple, Best Buy, and Staples are often able to accept them for recycling. Call your local store to find out more.

## **What should I do with my devices before recycling them?**

Before recycling your devices, we suggest backing up your devices and saving any data you might want to keep (contacts, photos, etc.), resetting the device to factory settings, and removing the case and/or screen protector.
